This American gospel song became popular in England in the late 19th century, then returned to this country in the mid-20th century with the Billy Graham crusades. Its continuing popularity may well be due to the freedom from subjective considerations in its praise of God.

Refrain

Praise the Lord, praise the Lord; let the earth hear his voice!

The first line of the refrain features a treble and bass staff in E-flat major (three flats). The melody in the treble staff consists of eighth and quarter notes, while the bass staff provides a harmonic accompaniment with chords and moving lines.

The second line continues the melody and accompaniment from the first line, maintaining the same musical structure and key signature.
