IRVINGTON PRESBYTERIAN RECEIVES INDYGO FOUNDATION GRANT FOR NEIGHBORS IN NEED OF PUBLIC TRANSIT

The Irvington Presbyterian Church has received a \$2,000 grant from IndyGo Foundation to further the work of the Irvington Community Advocacy Network (ICAN). The IndyGo Foundation's mission is to help connect people to their lives through accessible, equitable, and inclusive public transportation solutions.


