

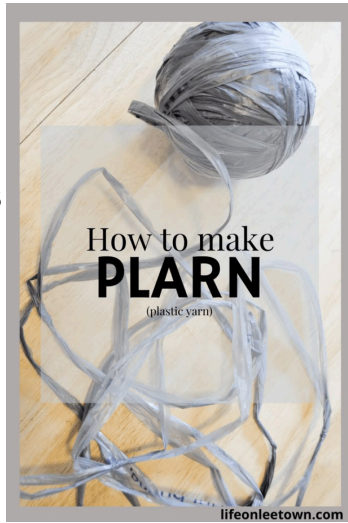

IRVINGTON PRESBYTERIAN RECEIVES INDYGO FOUNDATION GRANT FOR NEIGHBORS IN NEED OF PUBLIC TRANSIT


The Irvington Presbyterian Church has received a \$2,000 grant from IndyGo Foundation to further the work of the Irvington Community Advocacy Network (ICAN). Grant funds will be used to purchase bus passes which are an essential resource the church offers to neighbors who come to ICAN or the church when they are in moments of crisis or seasons of need. For those who cannot afford a vehicle, public transit passes are the key to access healthcare, education, employment, and much more.

The IndyGo Foundation's mission is to help connect people to their lives through accessible, equitable, and inclusive public transportation solutions.


