Some Strange State Laws A 1910 Oklahoma state law -- Every person guilty of secretly loitering about any building with the intent to overhear and to repeat or publish the same to annoy, is guilty of a misdemeanor. It is allowable to overhear juicy gossip accidentally, but not intentionally. Also, it is a \$1.00 fine for swearing in public.

A 1965 law in Alabama states it is a misdemeanor to pretend to be a member of the clergy. Whoever, being in a public place and fraudulently pretends by garb or outward array to be a minister of any religion is quilty. Better pick another costume for Halloween.

In North Carolina you cannot play bingo for more than

five hours. In 1835 lotteries were banned.

Today bingo is allowed for fund raising providing the prize is less than \$10.00.

In Utah, Happy Hour is illegal. Now it is "appy hour" where appetizers are on sale. Drinks are allowed but only 1.5 oz. of alcohol per drink, so no doubling, although cocktails are allowed. Mixed drinks can feature 2.5 ounces of total spirits, as long as the other ounce is a less potent spirit. Last call is also 1 a.m.
