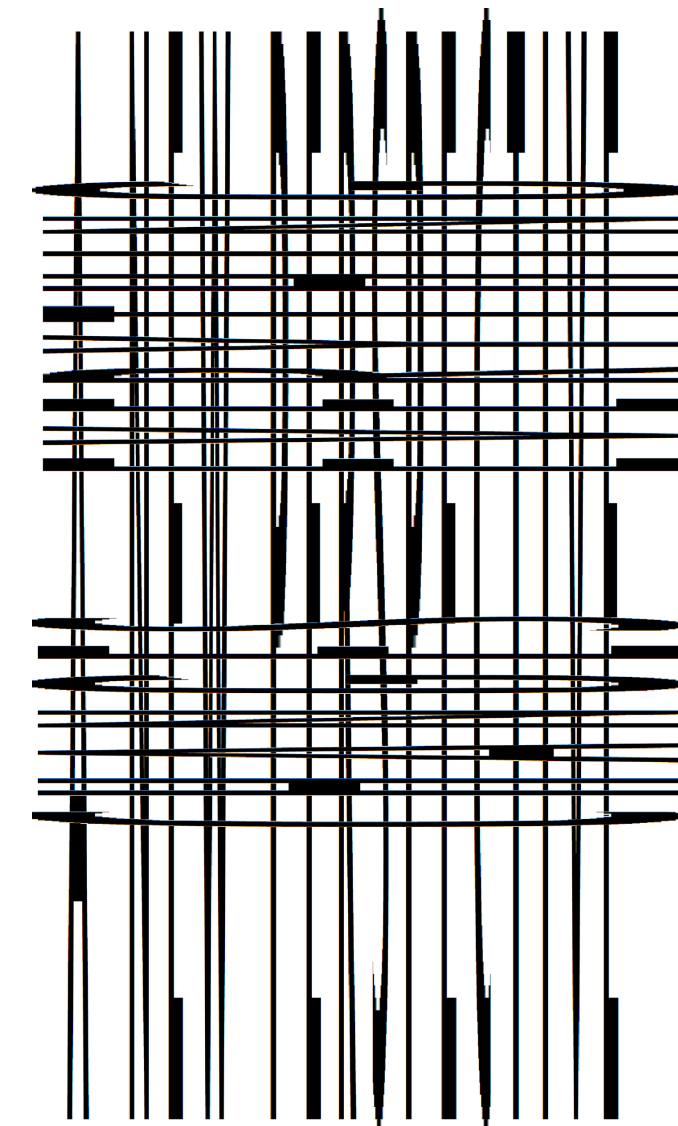

*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

from the Confession of 1967 (II.A.2. §5)

What is the role of ordered ministries in the Church and its mission?

All members are responsible for ministry. Each member acts as the Church in the world, endowed by the Holy Spirit with some gift of ministry, and is responsible for the integrity of their witness in their own particular situation, with the guidance and support of the Christian community.

In recognition of special gifts of the Spirit, and for the ordering of its life as a community, the Church calls, trains, and authorizes certain members for leadership and oversight. They are set apart by ordination and thus made responsible for that work.

The Church orders its life as an institution with administrative structures, like officers, but these are simply instruments of mission. These structures are meant to be reformed and calibrated to make each office a more effective tool for the church's ministry of reconciliation.

Symbolism In Our Sanctuary | Laying On Of Hands in prayers of installation and ordination is a tradition that can be traced to the first "new officers" in Acts 6 when the first Deacons are ordained.
