#### We are doing Pentecost right this year, friends!

Pentecost is the 49th day after Easter Sunday ("Pente-"= 50... close enough, right?) and traditionally marks the day when, after his resurrection and ascension, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon Jesus' disciples as they were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Feast of Weeks. While they were gathered together, the sound of a great wind entered and suddenly there were what looked like "tongues of fire" dancing on top of their heads. Then they all started speaking and preaching in different languages! Since the city was full of people from all over the known world, it was noticed, because they could all understand what was being said! Were the disciples multilinguists? No, but the Holy Spirit is! Because of the words the Holy Spirit spoke through the disciples that day, in languages they had never heard before, many people committed to join the disciples in following Christ's way and learning more about Jesus' teachings—3,000 people, in fact.

We say that Pentecost is the Church's birthday because it was the day that the proclamation of the Gospel really and truly began, and it was the day that thousands began to follow Jesus through the teachings of his disciples.

So, we bring out our red paraments, and I'll have my red robe. (I'm told that my dreams of pyrotechnics, while thematically appropriate, won't be included this year... \*sigh\*) Dr. Parker has pulled out all the musical instruments and the choirs have been preparing their music for the Sunday that will end their season. We are even going to be pointing out and celebrating the achievements of our graduates as they prepare to pass a milestone in life. It will be a Sunday of celebrating our community of faith, the culmination of another year of ministry together, and a musical offering of praise and gratitude for the blessings God has given. # HARM REDUCTION EDUCATION EVENT

Do not forget to mark your calendars for May 1st and

May 8th from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. The IPC Justice Advocacy Team is excited to partner with ICAN, **Overdose Lifeline and** the American Red Cross to provide education and training on the needs for harm reduction measures in our Irvington community. Participants will learn how to recognize the signs of an opioid overdose, how to administer the opioid overdose reversal drug naloxone, and what to expect after administration. The course will discuss how naloxone reverses an overdose and dispel some



myths about naloxone. We will also receive "Hands



Only" CPR training. Overdose Lifeline shares that "Overdose due to opioid use has become a leading cause of death in the US. Today, Americans are more likely to die due to an overdose than they are from cars and guns. Yet services, specifically

those aimed at overdose prevention and substance use help, do not meet the growing opioid crisis."


#### SAVE THE DATE COMMUNITY BOOK READ
