SINGING BOWLS are a type of inverted or standing bell whose history is traced back to China. Prayer bowls, as they are also known, are more common in Taoist and Buddhist traditions, though their use in religious practices is certainly not exclusive. They rose to popularity in the West around the 1970s when they began to appear in alternative medicine practices. Today, they tend to be associated with the New Age and "Tibetan" music genres as well as in meditative settings, both religious and non-religious alike. Many find that the "singing" has a way of calming an anxious mind and assists in focusing and refocusing one's thoughts.
