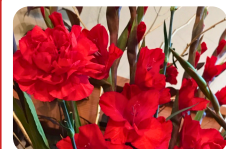

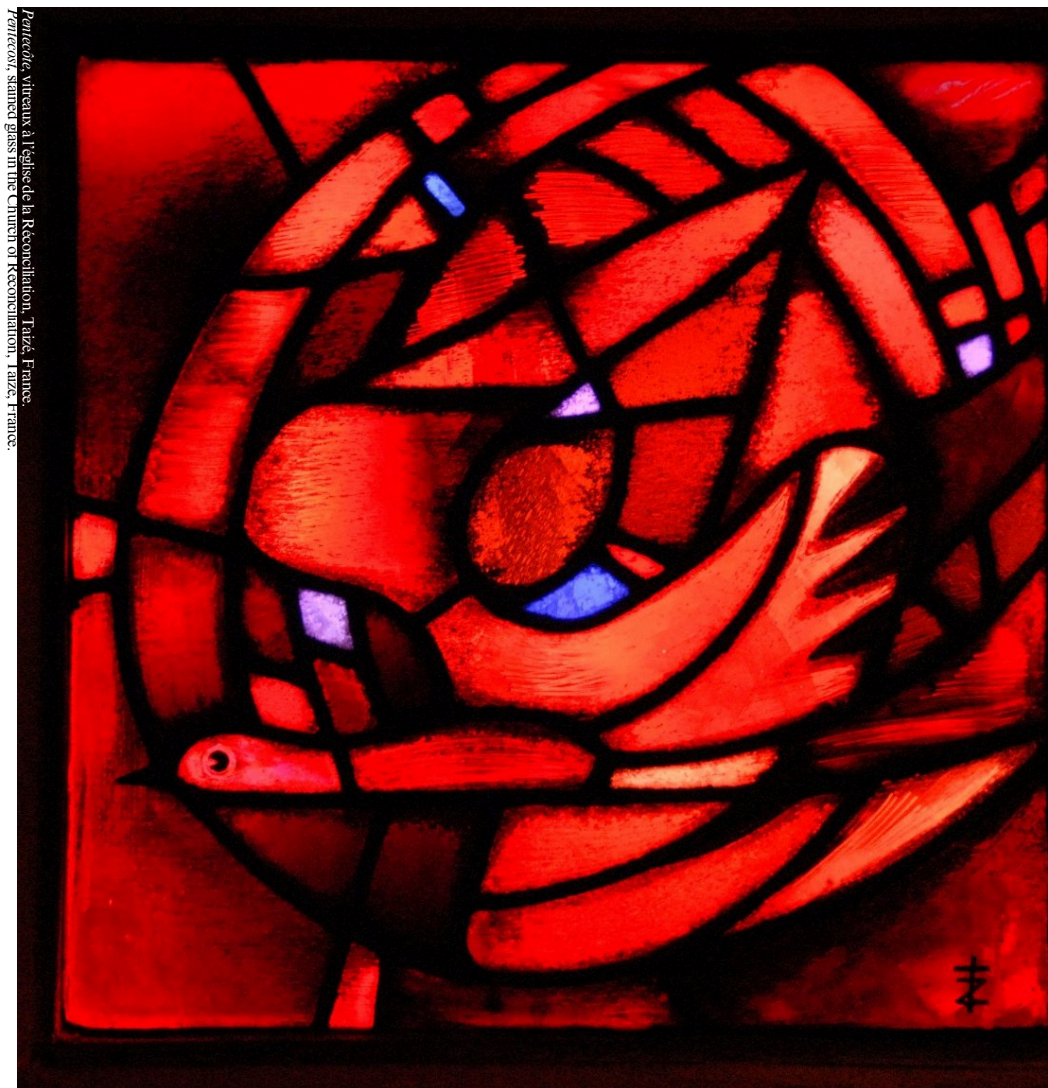

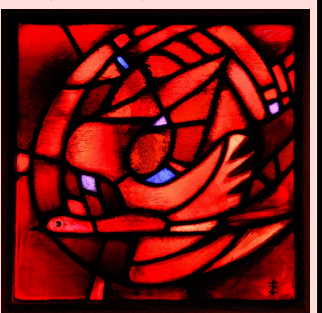

On the Cover | *Pentecôte, L'église de la Réconciliation, Taizé, France.*

After World War II, young Europeans of all backgrounds journeyed to Taizé seeking hope and peace. Together, they built the Church of Reconciliation, including its vast art collection. The window, called *Pentecost*, includes a prayer: "Holy Spirit, Comforter, we welcome you. Jesus promised that he would transmit them *the joy which abides*. In turn, we also hope to receive this joy. You set us in communion with one another, in all our diversity. And we ask you: Pour out your peace to all humanity. Amen."



Symbolism in the Sanctuary | What's with all the RED?
It's Pentecost! Every year, 49 days after Easter (*pente* = 50), we celebrate the day that the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the disciples who were gathered together (Acts 2). The color red is used to represent the fire of the Holy Spirit and love of God, so this is one of the special days that we use all our red paraments and décor. You may also see a dove, which is also used in Scripture to represent the Holy Spirit. Do you see other red, fire, dove, or other symbols that are meant to remind us of Pentecost?
