# JACK'S O R N E R Jack Simpson, IPC member, explores the archives for

explores the archives for stories of the church, its past members and other bits of interesting information and lore. The true story of Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer.

During the holiday season of 1938 came to Chicago, a man named Bob May who was nearly broke and exhausted from looking after his bedridden wife who was nearing the end of a two-year battle with cancer, which left Bob with raising his four year old daughter. One night his daughter asked why

her mommy wasn't like other mommy's. He remembered his own sickly childhood and how he was picked on by others. He wanted to give his daughter hope and

love, so that she would know he would always be there to take care of her.



He began to spin a tale about a Reindeer with a bright red nose that helped Santa Claus. She loved the story so much that she made him tell it every night. The story grew and grew. He made the story into a human picture book. A few days before Christmas, he reluctantly went to a Christmas Party at Montgomery Ward where he was encouraged to read the story. Montgomery Ward bought the rights to the book and over the next six years gave away six million copies to shoppers. Many publishing companies were making orders to carry the book. Four years later Bud was a millionaire. His new brother in-law, John Marks, set the story

> to music. The song was pitched to Bing Crosby and others, but they all passed until Gene Autry's wife insisted he record ' Rudolph'.

It became the second bestselling Christmas song behind White Christmas. As the song says – "He'll go down in History!"
