DEAR PRESBYTERIANS.

Worship is central to the life of Irvington Presbyterian. The music, God's Word proclaimed, and the relationships with God and each other are what bring us to worship on Sunday morning.

What is worship? Why do we worship? Worship is a foundational practice of healthy and vital churches. When we do not participate in worship we are neglecting an important part of living our faith. Worship is central to our purpose and mission as disciples of Christ in the world.

One definition of worship is encountering, experiencing, and embracing the Holy. Another says worship is the time we gather deliberately seeking to encounter God. We gather to honor God. We gather to connect with God. Worship is not performance; it is devotion and celebration expressing our love of God.

In our worship many things can happen when we encounter, experience and embrace the Holy. Lives can be transformed, wounded souls can be healed, hope can be renewed, discernment can be clarified, change can be encouraged, compassion can be inspired, and people can be bound together. All these things can happen, but the purpose is to honor and experience God.

We do not attend worship to squeeze God into our lives; we seek to integrate our lives with God's presence in the world. Worship is a time to think less about ourselves and more about our relationship with God. A time to think less about our personal agendas and more about God's will. We seek to encounter God so God's Spirit can reshape our lives and form us into the body of Christ.

I want to share with you parts of a prayer written by Dennis Shepherd, a member of a previous congregation I served. This is a prayer we are invited to pray as we gather in God's presence. I invite you to pray this prayer before worship to prepare your hearts and minds to focus on God. Let's see how God changes our worship as we pray together.

Dear Lord:

We welcome the Holy Spirit to come into our presence each time we gather together as a congregation of the people of God. We seek your presence among us. We offer our sanctuary and our hearts to be the tabernacle of God's dwelling.

May we sing every song as praise and worship from deep within our spirits. May we participate in the liturgy with our thoughts directed to God. May all we do, say, and think be an acceptable sacrifice from our innermost being.

Please keep our congregation founded and bound to the Holy Scriptures; keep us from straying from your voice. Keep our eyes upon Christ as the author and finisher of our faith. Complete the true purpose for this church as we keep yielding our wills to Your will.

Bind our life as a congregation to the unifying power of the Holy Spirit. Teach us to reach out into our community with the Good News of Jesus Christ. Teach us how to minister to all who are around us. Teach us to be an example before others so they will be drawn into the Body of Christ.

Bring honor and gratitude to the hearts of our congregation for all the things we have been blest with by you, O God. AMEN

This month we are not just thinking about it. We are focusing on praying and living it.
