


WORSHIP REOPENING

I sat down with Reverend
Heimach recently and asked
him about what he feels are his
successes and best memories
over his 17 plus years at
Irvington Presbyterian Church.

He started with our 100-Year Celebration in 2006. There were dinners, songs and a wonderful worship service that included some former IPC

ministers. He was also very pleased about our Hospitality House which provided low-cost housing for local AmeriCorp workers.

Renovating the pipe organ was also a highlight for him. The organ when he arrived was living on borrowed time. It was about 75 years old. It was the best on the market at the

time we bought it from a New York Company. A new one would cost over a million dollars. Renovation would cost \$330,000, but the improved sound and

lasting legacy was worth the money.

He is also pleased that during his ministry here, four Presbyterian women ministers have served on the staff including Mo Wilson, Liz Kaznak-Hall, Chelsea Benham, and Betsy Wood, in addition to Carolyn Lesmesiter, a Lutheran minister. He loved leading Christ Café and A Slice of Life, where we had some great discussions and lots of laughs, and despite some edgy topics, we always left as friends. He was happy to take part in the start of a Day Care Ministry, which is turning out to be an important mission for the church, possibly even to the point of being enlarged! And, of course, he loves our solar panels which have saved the church about \$4,000 each year.

He has learned more than he ever wanted to know about boilers, leaky roofs, and the maintenance of rental units, although he is pleased the building and grounds are in great shape right now. And though we have lost many beloved members in his years here, we added approximately 200 new members. He is also thankful for our financial strength. Next month we will talk again with Bob on the topic of – well you will have to wait until next month.
