

Wondering and wandering with purpose, and grateful to do it with you,



DR. WEBB PARKER | Dr. Parker's participation in the life of IPC is not necessarily changing, as much as it is being formally recognized and compensated, now that the Irvington Arts Collective—an outreach of IPC—has officially launched. Webb will continue to serve as the Director of Music at IPC but has added to his title the Founding Artistic & Executive Director of the Irvington Arts Collective (IAC). The IAC started weekly rehearsals of its core program, Harmony Collected Community Chorus, on Monday, January 22nd, and has many other activities taking shape as it seeks to serve Irvington and the East side. We celebrate with Dr. Parker as he leads this ever-growing outreach!

BRUCE STROUD | Bruce has given notice of his desire to retire as the Treasurer of Irvington Presbyterian Church. We are deeply grateful for his service, especially through the pastoral transitions in recent months. Bruce has graciously agreed to stay until early March to permit time for a new Treasurer to be hired and trained before he trades his accounting visor for sunglasses and enjoys his well-deserved retirement. (Do you know of a potential part-time Treasurer? Contact the Church office for more details.)

THE REV. MAUREEN WILSON | February 1st marks the end of our contract with Designated Associate Pastor Mo. Pastor Mo has been one of the central threads of consistency for this congregation and its leadership, even though her actual position and title rarely remained static for long. For her flexibility in service, readiness to minister, stability in presence, and overall leadership through transitional times, we owe Pastor Mo a debt of gratitude.

February 1st also marks the introduction of a new role. In response to the congregation's strong desire to see intentional engagement with the Irvington community and interest in broadening the scope and impact of Christian Education, the Personnel Committee spent several weeks discerning what staffing solution would best meet those needs and fit our budget. In December, Session approved the job description for a 25-hr/wk Director of Faith Formation & Community Engagement and hired Rev. Wilson to fill that role upon the fulfillment of her current contract.

This is a significant transition for Irvington Presbyterian Church: we will have only one full-time pastor! Our church leadership believes that this arrangement is the way to balance our financial capacity, with the call we feel to intentionally focus on spiritual development and on relationship building with our neighbors. We are grateful that Pastor Mo is excited to focus on these specific ministries and that she felt moved to serve in this part-time role. We are blessed to have other several pastors in our community who support us, both formally and informally, and outstanding staff members who are creative, pastoral, and deeply invested in their work. The hope is that you might see these changes and notice with us the new possibilities and opportunities that will begin to spring up! Help us notice where God is at work and join in where you see things might be straining to keep up. We are an ever-changing institution in a quick-moving world; as much as it can be hard to keep up with all that is changing around us, churches who are willing to keep trying new things are the ones who find new and incredible ways of showing God's love to the world. So be encouraged, friends! What a blessing to have so much newness springing up all around us!
